About the Course

Foundation Course, English Language

B.A. /BSc./B.Com. First Year

This course is mainly based on English Language and Indian Culture. The heritage of India's composite culture is taught through this text. All the lessons systematically present one or the other aspect of Indian culture, ancient and modern. The exercises have been tied with the text. The vigour of the contents enlivens the students to be proficient in the skills of the English Language.

B.A. /BSc./B.Com. Second Year

This course is mainly based on the development of Science in India. The Major ancient Indian scientists have been discussed in detail like Sushruta ,the father of Plastic Surgery ,Charak's description of human body and various organs, 'Kanada's' Atomic Theory and Patanjali who first presented the fundamentals and techniques of Yoga. There's a talk about many other scientists like 'Aryabhata', 'Srinivasa Ramanujan' and J.C Bose who made a vital contribution in the development of Science. Students are also introduced to Communication in the modern age, Computers, Water Pollution and Fighting Diseases etc. Further the course is very helpful in enriching the vocabulary and grammatical concept of students by various exercises tied with the text.

The syllabus is designed so as to generate among the students the knowledge and awareness and modern outlook and total view of life. At the graduate level, the students are familiarised with the national heritage and the values of Indian life and social system.
